#### **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

Ernest Heppner was born in Breslau, Germany in 1921. In 1939, amidst persecution of the Jewish people in Germany, he and his mother fled to Shanghai, China. He was interned in the Shanghai Ghetto by Japanese armed forces after Pearl Harbor and liberated by U.S. troops at the end of WWII. From 1945 to 1947 Heppner was a civilian employee of the U.S. Advisory Group to the Chinese Armed Forces. Then, in 1947 he came to the U.S. and settled in Indianapolis, IN in 1954.

Ernest Heppner met and married his wife, Illo, in 1945 in the Shanghai Ghetto. They had 1 daughter, Anita. In 1993, Heppner authored the book, *Shanghai Refuge: A Memoir of the World War II Jewish Ghetto*. Heppner made many speeches, gave lectures and wrote articles about the Holocaust, extremism, and racism. He was active in a number of different organizations including the Anti-Defamation League and the Indianapolis Jewish Community Relations Council. Heppner died on 6 October 2004.

#### **SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE**

Series one contains information about Ernest Heppner's speeches, awards, and book publication. It begins with some copies of speeches that Heppner made with some photographs from those events. Then, there is some correspondence between Heppner and people who appreciated his story and information from lectures and other events. Three folders (4-6) contain publicity and announcements for events where Heppner will be featured. These are at a number of different venues for a variety of audiences. There are two folders about open debates of history that Heppner played a key role in. The last part of this series contains a scrapbook and some loose materials that went with that. The scrapbook contains certificates, clippings, announcements, photographs, and correspondence about Heppner's accomplishments and events. It also contains materials dealing with his efforts on behalf of Vietnam POWs and the "Angel of Curaco."

Series two has 10 VHS videos. These were recordings of Heppner's interviews and documentaries. The two main subjects are the Final Solution in Germany (including Kristallnacht) and the Ku Klux Klan in Indiana.
