HISTORICAL/BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

"THE BEGINNINGS AND ENDINGS of all human undertakings are untidy," so wrote John Galsworthy, early twentieth century English and Nobel laureate. And so was it true of Woodruff Place, an upscale nineteenth century residential area carved out of land on the near eastside of downtown Indianapolis, and which continues to this day.

Founded in 1872 by James O. Woodruff, Woodruff Place, began as a stately and fashionable retreat for those with means to fit into the community. Lots cost as much as \$5,000 (later \$8,000), and builders were obliged to erect houses whose construction cost a minimum of \$20,000. Bounded on the north by 10th Street, on the south by Michigan Street, on the west side by West Drive, on the east by East Drive, the whole was connected north and south by Middle Drive, and east and west by Cross Drive.

Woodruff's own house, the first to go up on the southeast corner of West and Cross drives, was a three-story house with a fourth floor tower room--with fine woodwork, tiled floors, a walnut staircase, a ballroom with inlaid oak, and the first porte-cochère in the city. Booth Tarkington, the Hoosier writer, thought the Woodruff home was the pride of the Hoosier capital. Unfortunately it was razed in 1936.

Woodruff Place, "a town within a town," was incorporated in 1876. Indianapolis provided much of the police and fire protection—a Town Marshall patrolled the streets and picked up trash—but reaped little of the tax benefits from the affluent community. The struggle against annexation began in 1913, but was not resolved for nearly a half-century. In 1961 the city tentatively attached The Place. The final gasps of independence for the private development were heard the following year when the U.S. Supreme Court refused to hear an appeal, a bitter pill for the residents to accept. Later some admitted that in retrospect the annexation was not as bad as they had feared.

In an effort to maintain something of the beauty and eminence of The Place a Board of Trustees, in a General Ordinance of 1937, set limits (with penalties) for the location of trades, general commercial enterprises, height of buildings, size of lawns and garages, advertising, and the like—all with the hope of improving appearances and maintaining some semblance of gentility. But inevitably when home owners are unable maintain large homes they are sold and converted into apartments. So it happened in The Place where some homes accommodated three or four renter families.

Alleged neglect of the community in 1968 led a local committee to plead with Indianapolis' Mayor Richard Lugar for

better services. Four years later the name and location of Woodruff Place were placed in the National Register of Historic Places. About that same time it received several grants for major repairs for long neglected outdoor art, and the restoration of some homes to their earlier stately character. Meanwhile the City Parks Department planted trees and shrubs, restored ornamental pots, replenished flower beds, and repaired some of the fountains.

Today (early 21st century) one can stroll through the streets, admire the splendor of yore, and enjoy (at least in memory) what Mr. Woodruff and his friends doubtless knew so well in the late 19th century, that Galsworthy was correct: both the beginnings *and the endings* of all undertakings are untidy. So has it been of Woodruff Place. Nevertheless Woodruff Place lives on today, encouraged and financed by residents who will not let the dream die.

James O. Woodruff was born in Auburn, New York, on 25 July 1840. The son of Harmon Woodruff, he was educated in the elementary schools of that west-central city of New York state. From there he matriculated in Philips Academy, in Andover, Massachusetts, where he finished his college preparatory work with highest honors.

Following the attack on Fort Sumter in 1861, young Woodruff enlisted as a Second Lieutenant in the Union Army, but prior to going off to war married Elmina Adsit, daughter of a minister. His military service ended in 1863 when due to an illness he resigned his commission. He spent three years in Florida with his wife, regaining his health and strength. While there he devised a plan for a floating college with teachers/professors to instruct pupils while traveling around the world aboard ship. The program would draw from the upper class of society and would include U.S. Naval Academy cadets for academic instruction and for sailing the vessel. Unfortunately, the ship never left port, despite much planning and work.

In the mid-nineteenth century Indianapolis, seeing the need for improved streets, public lights and city-wide water, invited (1872) Mr. Woodruff, an engineer with the Central Canal Company of Rochester, New York, to come to the Hoosier capital to design and establish a water works for the city. After arriving in the Indiana capital Woodruff bought 80 acres of land, subdivided it into 240 lots to be developed with houses of neo-Jacobean and Eastlake architecture, esplanades, lawns, statuary and fountains.

Despite realistic plans for his residential area, the Panic of '73 hit Indianapolis—and James Woodruff—hard. By 1876 he lost his fortune and returned to the East. During the next few years he devoted himself to launching his floating university. Unfortunately, while in Boston he became ill, and eight days later died on 4 June 1879 in New York City, only weeks short of his 39th birthday. He left a wife and two boys. His obituary listed the cause of death as "congestion of the brain," a diagnosis not immediately confirmed.

Materials in collection

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The majority of the materials in the collection were collected by Paul Richardson during his eight year stay in Woodruff Place in the 1970s. The collection is comprised of copy prints of old photographs, some original photographs taken by Walter N. Carpenter, printed and manuscript materials, and negatives.

Series 1: Woodruff Place Photographs is a mixture of original and copy photographs. The photographs are arranged by street (East Drive, Middle Drive, West Drive, etc.) with descriptions of some of the houses, fountains, and statues and their locations. At the end of this series are various subjects showing images from the J.L. Mott Iron Works catalog, a map of Woodruff Place, postcards, and images used in promotions and advertising.

Series 2: Walter N. Carpenter family, of 926 West Drive, contains original photographs taken by him. These include photos of community events and friends and family, particularly his children, around the neighborhood ca. 1890 to 1936. Many individuals and locations are identified in the same handwriting and appear to be taken from family albums.

Series 3: Printed and Manuscript Materials contains an early lithograph of Woodruff Place, news clippings, copies of the 1937 general ordinance and 1972 application to the National Register of Historic Places, research papers of Nelle Coats, an unpublished manuscript by Harold Olin, and some correspondence.

Series 4: Negatives are arranged in chronological order and appear to be related to the restoration work, the home tours, documentation of vandalism and restoration, the fountains and statuary, and copies of old photographs. Most of the images can be found in the photographs but not all negatives have prints.
