#### HISTORICAL/BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Construction of the George Rogers Clark Memorial in George Rogers Clark National Historical Park, Vincennes, Indiana, began 1 September 1931. The memorial was one feature in the construction of the park. The Indiana George Rogers Clark Sesquicentennial Commission directed the project. Architect Frederic Charles Hirons designed the memorial. Local labor completed the memorial in spring 1933. President Franklin D. Roosevelt dedicated the structure and the park on 14 June 1936.

The obituary for Harry E. Armstead states that he was a "retired insurance man and former aerial photographer." Armstead's aerial photography included aerial mosaics, Civilian Conservation Corps camps, and images used by the *Indianapolis Star* rotogravure section. Armstead worked for the Employers Liability Assurance Company for twenty-five years. He died 21 January 1954.
