Randolph was the grandaughter of Northwest Territory governor Arthur St. Clair (1736-1818) and wife of Thomas Randolph, attorney general of the Indiana Territory at Vincennes, Knox County (1808-1811).

The collection consists of Randolph's letters to family members written from Cincinnati, Ohio (1808), Vincennes (1810), and Jeffersonville, Clark County (1814); and letters to Randolph from her mother and stepfather, Elizabeth and Gen. James Dill, written from Natchez, Miss. (1805), and Lawrenceburg, Dearborn County (1808-1816). The correspondence includes numerous references to Arthur St. Clair and William Henry Harrison.
