BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Robert W. Kellum (1901-1986) graduated from Earlham College, where among other activities he had been campus correspondent for the <u>Indianapolis Star</u>.

After graduation he worked one year for the Star, then three years for the <u>Indianapolis News</u>. In 1929 he rejoined the <u>Star</u>, becoming assistant city editor in 1937, city editor in 1940, and business and financial editor in 1948.

After 1950, and until his retirement in 1966, Kellum worked part-time at the <u>Star</u>, mainly as a feature writer, and the rest of the time as executive secretary of the Indiana Flood Control and Water Resources Commission. This position resulted from a casual airplane conversation between <u>Star</u> publisher Eugene C. Pulliam and TVA director David Lilienthal. Kellum's work on the Commission led to legislation expanding the doctrine of riparian rights, and to a statewide plan for fifteen reservoirs serving multiple purposes: flood control, electric power, and recreation. One result of this plan was the development of Eagle Creek Reservoir and Park in Indianapolis.

Beginning in 1957, Kellum was also a member of the Great Lakes Commission.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

This collection, filling three folders, consists of typed autobiographical sketches, mimeographed material, and telegrams, from the period 1945-1961. It is arranged chronologically within category.
