### **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

John M Harlan was commissioned in the Kentucky 10<sup>th</sup> Infantry as a colonel on 21 November 1861. He resigned on 6 April 1863 due to the death of his father. William E. Ludlow was mustered into the Indiana 10<sup>th</sup> Infantry as a sergeant on 18 September 1861. He was promoted to 1<sup>st</sup> lieutenant and adjutant on 22 June 1862. He was mustered out on 20 September 1864.

Oliver P. Morton was the fourteenth governor of Indiana. He established himself as a "War Governor" because of his strong efforts to support the war, one of which was to allow Indiana residents to apply in the Kentucky army.
