BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Cyrus C. Hines was a resident of Indianapolis and enlisted in the army on 24 April 1861 as a Sergeant. He was mustered into H Company, Indiana 11th Infantry. He was discharged for a promotion in June, and re-enlisted as a Major on 31 July where he was commissioned into Field & Staff, Indiana 24th Infantry. On 6 March 1862 he was again promoted, this time to Colonel of Indiana 57th Infantry. He participated in the battle of Shiloh, and was wounded 31 December 1862 at the battle of Stones River. He resigned on 27 July 1863.

Gordon Tanner was a resident of Indianapolis and enlisted in the army on 2 August 1861 as a Major. He was commissioned into Field & Staff, Indiana 22nd Infantry. He died on 2 October 1861 of wounds sustained in a skirmish.
