## HISTORICAL SKETCH

The Office of Price Administration (OPA) was in charge of rationing and price caps during World War II. They were the government agency that regulated prices on most consumer goods. In the beginning, many stores did not heed the regulations and the agency had to put more restrictions requiring compliance in place. OPA also handled rationing. Many items were rationed during the war, including tires, cars, gas, coffee, meats and other food stuffs. OPA was in place for the duration of the war and even a little after, finally shutting down in 1947.
