SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The collection contains 16 receipts, promissory notes, and a notice letter once owned by Samuel Cooper and other family members living in Madison, Indiana from 1804–1860. The receipts and promissory notes discuss debts owed and paid regarding the Cooper family. The one letter in the collection issued on 8 August 1860, is a request for the Marshall of Kentucky to summon Mayfield Lindsay Cooper and other named individuals to appear before the Circuit Court of Kentucky at Federal Court Hall in Covington, Kentucky on 11 September 1860. They were summoned to testify on behalf of plaintiff and Indiana citizen, Delia Webster against the defendant and Kentucky citizen, Bently Monroe. The issue was described as a "certain matter of controversy."
