BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

George Henry Miller was born on January 5, 1915 in Manville, Indiana. He was in the journalism field for over 71 years, starting out for the Indianapolis News, and working with other newspapers in Indiana, Kentucky, and Missouri. After serving the U.S. Navy during World War II as a line officer, Miller did editorial work for several Midwest newspapers before attending graduate school at the University of Illinois. After graduation, Miller was hired as an Associate Professor of Journalism at Butler University. Miller left Butler University after three years to found and edit a major business magazine in Louisville, KY before he eventually left to resume teaching in Florida. He served as the Director of the Cooperative Education Program at the University of South Florida for 12 years. He also served as a consultant to the U.S. Office of Education on several occasions. By the time of his death, on August 1, 2004, Miller had over 30 years experience in teaching at the university level. Miller survived by his wife, June Reynolds Miller, and their only son Jacob Lee Miller. His parents were Silas Jacob and Georgia Renetta Haumesser Miller.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The collection contains papers written in 1947 and 1948 by George Henry Miller while he was a student at the University of Illinois and an assistant professor at Butler University. The papers cover the history of Indiana Journalism, Fort Miamis, and early Wabash River settlements. The term papers are fifty to sixty pages in length. The collection also contains a one page biography, curricula vitae, and resume for George Henry Miller.
