BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Nat Logan Smith (born 1921) lived in Charlotte, Tennessee, but had relatives in Kokomo, Indiana, and spent about a

year with them in 1944-1945, apparently after serving as a medical technician in the armed forces. He attended the University of Tennessee in 1940, and returned to a medical training course there in the spring of 1945. While studying, he had a job in a hospital.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

This collection, filling one small manuscript box, contains letters addressed to Nat Logan Smith between 1940 and 1949. His most frequent correspondents were: his cousin Agnes L. Smith, with whom he had lived in Kokomo; Alice Ledman, a church secretary in Huntington, Indiana; and Betty Crumrine of Fort Wayne. A few of the letters are from friends in the armed services.
