## **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

Everett E. Hodgin (1870-4 December 1923) was an Indianapolis Physician and President of the City Board of Health. Born in Westfield, Indiana, he attended Earlham College. Hodgin went on to study medicine at the Physio-Medical College in Indianapolis, where he graduated in 1896. He continued his education at the Indiana Medical College in Indianapolis, graduating in 1901. He set up practice in Indianapolis, and kept that practice for the remainder of his life.

During Charles Bookwalter's second mayoral administration (1906-1909), Hodgin was appointed to the post of Police Surgeon, giving him a start in local politics. He was active in several Republican campaigns in Marion County, working as campaign manager for Lew Shank's mayoral bid in 1921. Upon Shank's election, Hodgin was offered the position of City Controller but declined in order to become President of the City Board of Health, a post he held until his death. As president, he was responsible for the growth and success of City Hospital.

Hodgin married his first wife, Hattie White, in 1895, and had two children: Jack Hodgin and Agnes Hodgin Norris. His wife died ca. 1906, and Hodgin remarried two years later. A third child, Lois Ann, came from his second marriage. Hodgin was a member of the Society of Friends, the American Medical Association, the Indiana State Medical Association, and the Marion County Medical Society.

#### SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The collection consists of two large ledgers, a large notebook, a small ledger, a small notebook, three prescription copy notebooks, file cards and miscellaneous papers. The large ledgers and the large notebook have been unbound and stored as manuscripts. Blank pages have been removed, and the original order maintained. The cards have been stored in Folders 8-9 and are in their original order. Blank cards and dividers have been removed.

The ledger, 1906-1921, is comprised of four parts. Part 1 is an alphabetical index listing patient names and addresses. Part two is newspaper clippings glued to the ledger pages and date from 1921. The clipping are related to Lew Shank's mayoral campaign; Hodgin was Shank's campaign manager. The third part, 1906-1910, lists patient name, reason for call, date and fee. It is arranged by patient name and is not in alphabetical or chronological order. The last part is a running financial account of cash paid out, cash taken in, and credit, dating from October 5, 1910 to January 8, 1911.

The second ledger is labelled "Patrolmen" and dates from 1907, when Hodgin held the post of Police Surgeon. It is arranged in two parts: an alphabetical index of patient names and a reason for call and date. The records are not in alphabetical or chronological order. The notebook contains obstetrical records dating from 1920-1923. It includes information about the wife and husband, family health, the woman's obstetrical records, physical examination results and the delivery of the child. At the end are notes written on the back of obstetrical records forms. The records are not arranged alphabetically or chronologically.

The miscellaneous papers include a letter (1918), a bill and what appears to be a list of charity patients dating from 1940, well after Hogdin's death. The prescription copies are in notebook form and date from 1921-1923. The small bound ledger dates from September 19, 1898 to August 1, 1909 and is a running list, by date, of calls on patients. Information includes patient name, address, reason for call, and fee. The small notebook contains a diary of a trip to Washington, D.C., dating from June 27 to July 4, 1922.

Patient record cards, 1912-1920, include name, address, date of service or payment, and fee. In many cases only the day and month are given for the date. Added at the back of the file are miscellaneous papers found with the cards.
