BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

William Thorn (fl. 1847) settled in North Manchester, Indiana, (Wabash Co.) around 1837-1838. In 1839, Thorn and Mahlon C. Frame opened a dry goods and grocery store at the corner of Main and Walnut streets in North Manchester.

About 1851, William and Isaac Thorn (fl. 1847), along with John Comstock formed a private detective service to combat "an organization of horse-thieves, burglars, and counterfeiters extending from Ohio across [northern] Indiana into...Illinois." (Helm, p. 288). A few arrests in Wabash County were made due to this service.

No information was found in available sources for Thomas Thorn (d. 1846-1847?) or Nancy W. Thorn (fl. 1847).
