### HISTORICAL SKETCH

The New Albany and Portland Ferry Company operated between New Albany, Indiana, and Portland, Kentucky, a town adjoining Louisville, in the period 1860-1885. Interests in the firm were held by Mrs. E. M. McHarry, Moses Irvin, and W. A. Duckwall. Names of boats which occur in the company's records include the <u>Ben South</u>, <u>Night</u>, <u>Music</u>, <u>Adelaide</u>, <u>Excelsior</u>, <u>Frank McHarry</u>, and <u>Thomas Conner</u>. During the Civil War, the firm did a good deal of work for the federal government, including a trip to Fort Donelson by the <u>Ben South</u>.

### **SCOPE AND CONTENT**

This collection, coming from four different sources, includes invoices, logs, receipts, and portage and cash books, some in photocopy form. The collection covers the period 1862-1884. Day-to-day receipts and expenses make up the bulk of the record. The photocopied log of the <u>Ben South</u>'s trip to Fort Donelson in [1864?] is the longest account given.
