HISTORICAL SKETCH

Helen F. Willkie and her husband, Fredrick Willkie, were the owners of the Booth Tarkington Home in 1959. They apparently intended to sell the house in order that it be preserved as an historical Landmark. No additional information on Helen F. Willkie is available.

The Booth Tarkington House had a succession of ten owners, after the Willkies, who attempted to restore and maintain the house in the original style that the Booth Tarkington family had created. The house, built in 1904-05 and occupied by Mr. Tarkington from 1918-1946, is located at 4270 N. Meridian.
