BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Henry C. Parker (d. 1904) lived in Indianapolis and had a wife, Amanda. The 1901 city directory lists him as a blacksmith living at 7 South Emerson Avenue. The 1905 city directory lists Amanda Parker (widow of Lewis [sic]), living at the rear of 907 1/2 East 11th Street.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

This collection contains two items, bills for the funeral and burial of Henry C. Parker in February 1904. One bill, from Flanner & Buchanan, Funeral Directors, itemizes funeral expenses. This was a fairly sizeable funeral, for there were charges for seven dozen chairs and eight hacks. The second bill, from Crown Hill Cemetery, charges for a lot and for interment.
