BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Thomas Ehrlich (b. 1934) was born in Cambridge, Mass., the son of William and Evelyn (Seltzer) Ehrlich. He graduated from Harvard in 1956. Three years later he received a law degree from Harvard, and then was admitted to the Wisconsin bar. He served as law clerk to Judge Learned Hand.

From 1968 to 1975 Ehrlich taught law at Leland Stanford University, serving as dean the last four years. From 1981 to 1987 he was provost and professor of law at the University of Pennsylvania, and from 1987 to 1994 he was president and professor of law at Indiana University. He was author and co-author of several books on international law.
