The Indianapolis Independent Friends meeting was organized in the mid-1930s, and continued at least through 1950. It was not formally organized as a monthly meeting, and did not have a regular meeting place. Members chose rather to spend their energy and time on projects, often in cooperation with American Friends Service Committee and its local Work Camp, and with Flanner House. Projects included settling refugees from Europe in 1939, supporting conscientious objectors during World War II, opposing conscription, and sending food packages to Europe at the end of World War II. Prominent in the organization were Stanton Bailey, Edith Farquhar, and Esther A. Palmer.

This collection, filling three folders, contains correspondence, newsletters, and other organizational material, dated 1939-1950. It is arranged chronologically.

The subject matter illustrates the gradually changing interests of this earnest, informal group.
