BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Andrew Smith, Jr., (1860-1924) was the son of Catherine (Kennington) and Andrew Smith, Sr. He was born in Indianapolis, and educated in public schools. At age 15, he began work as a messenger for Western Union Telegraph

Company. Smith married Katie Wenger in 1886, and had one son, George Andrew. In 1887, he took a position at Fletcher Bank, and worked there for 22 years; sixteen as a teller. When the American National Bank was formed in 1900, Smith became one of their assistant cashiers. He was vice president at Capitol National Bank from 1904 to 1912 before becoming vice president at Indiana National Bank upon their merger with Capitol National. Smith served as secretary of the Indiana Bankers Association.

Robert L. O'Hair (1853?-1925) was the president of Central National Bank and Central Trust Company from 1893 until ill health forced him to resign in 1922. He was then elected chairman of the Board of Directors for the bank.
