## **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

Nannie Adeline Claghorn was born August 22, 1899 in Switzerland County, Indiana, to John and Prudence Claghorn. She married Clyde Haine, Sr. on June 23, 1920 in Indianapolis. She lived in Indianapolis most of her life, excluding a few years that she lived in Basin, Wyoming. She had two children: Clyde Haine, Jr. and Martha. She was employed by the Veterans Administration for several years during World War II, also by R. L. Polk Co., Publishers, retiring from there in 1977. She was an active member of East 10th United Methodist Church in Indianapolis and was Past President of its Everson Class. She was also an active member of White Cross Guild of Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis since 1951, serving as president of the general guild from 1981-1983. Her husband passed away in 1968. Adeline moved to Fort Collins, Colorado in 1994 to live with her daughter Martha Zielen and her husband Alexander. She died on October 23, 2002, at the age of 103 in a Colorado nursing home. Her burial was held at Memorial Park Cemetery in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Adeline's brother Irvin is featured extensively in this collection. He served in WWI and then married Daisy Denny in 1919. They had one son, Jack, who died in 1937 at the age of 17 from injuries sustained when hit by an automobile while delivering telegraphs.

## **SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE**

This collection contains documents belonging to Adeline Haine, as well as James Claghorn, her father, John, and brother, Irvin. Many of the documents are legal papers, receipts, and letters. A majority of the letters were written by Irvin to Adeline, while he served in WWI. Within the collection are also numerous clippings, booklets, some of which pertain to the White River flood of 1913, a Polk County history, along with a diploma belonging to Irvin, and a postmaster certificate for James Claghorn. Visual items include numerous black and white photographs and portraits, some from Irvin's time in WWI, and many showing members of the Claghorn family.
