BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Bryon Ray Lewis (1880–1976) was born in Petty Township, Lawrence County, Illinois. He attended Vincennes University and the University of Illinois where he graduated with a degree in history. He went on to teach at Bridgeport Township High School where he became principal in 1917. He married Miss Luella Eaton on July 6, 1916. Lewis spent much of his time researching George Rogers Clark, Vincennes, and Kaskaskia.
