BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Dr. Marilyn Snyder Bartlett (1928–2015) was born in Nebraska but soon moved to Indianapolis where she graduated from Shortridge High School and Purdue University where she majored in chemistry and microbiology. She received her Doctor of Medical Science degree from Purdue University, Indianapolis (IUPUI). After working at Geneva Hospital in New York, she joined the faculty at Indiana University School of Medicine in the Pathology Department from where she retired. In 2000 she was named a Fulbright Research Scholar to improve the diagnoses of infectious diseases in immune compromised patients in Kenya, Africa.

Dr. Bartlett married James D. Bartlett (b. 1928) and they had five children.
