BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

George MacLucas was born 1 March 1916. He was the son of Indianapolis, Ind., architect William Harold MacLucas. When he was nineteen years old the elder MacLucas immigrated from England to the United States in 1905. He moved to Indiana and married his wife in Kokomo; the couple had two sons and one daughter. He assisted in the construction of numerous Indianapolis buildings. These included the Allison and Fletcher estates, as well as the Seville Hotel Apartments, Balmoral Court Apartments, and Hampton Court Apartments.

As a child, George lived on Washington Boulevard in Indianapolis and his family traveled throughout Canada and Europe, following his father's jobs. He went to School 60 in Indianapolis. He was eight years old when his father died of a stroke in 1925.

MacLucas lived in Indianapolis until his death in October 1993.
