**BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

Hannah Ann Culley Mansur was born in Lawrenceburg, Indiana, around 1819, the daughter of newspaperman David V. Culley. In 1838 the family moved to Indianapolis, and in 1847, she married William Mansur, an Indianapolis businessman engaged in the pork industry. According to the source below, she was alive in 1907.
