BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Helen Hollingsworth (b. ca. 1890) was born on her family's farm near Lebanon in Boone County Indiana to Frank and Myme Hollingsworth. Financial conditions forced her parents to leave the family farm and move to North Indianapolis in 1898.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The collection consists of a twelve-page paper presented by Helen Hollingsworth to the Portfolio Club of Indianapolis on 15 March 1973. In her presentation Hollingsworth recounts the last days of the nineteenth century from an economic, social, and political standpoint. She also relates how she and her family welcomed in the new century, including her selection to play the little New Year character for the Social Dozen Club party. The collection also contains photocopied pages from the 1899 Indianapolis City Directory as well as a photocopy of a map of her North Indianapolis neighborhood from 1889.
