BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Hugh Bay, Private, Co. K 89th Regiment. He enrolled August 15, 1862 at Decatur, Indiana. He mustered in on August 28, 1862, at Indianapolis, Indiana by Captain Osborne at the age of 25. He was born in Ashland County, Ohio. His military service ended abruptly when he was killed in battle in Nashville, Tennessee on December 16, 1864.

All letters are written by Hugh Bay to his wife Cordeliann Bay. The majority of the letters are accompanied by typewritten transcripts. They are about his war experiences from August 22, 1862 to January 1865.
