## **BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH**

Jacob S. Hull (1842–1883) was born in Wabash County, Indiana, near the town of Lagro. In December, 1861, he enlisted in Company E of the 47th Indiana Regiment and was mustered out in October, 1865. Around 1865 he married Nancy E. Hull and lived in Polk, Huntington County, Indiana, where he worked in a sawmill.

## **SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE**
