BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCHES

The following individuals were identified in the album. Census records for 1860 and 1870 were searched and the information found is listed with each name. Most people were related but in some cases it was not possible to identify every individual in the census.

Because his image appears twice, at the beginning and the end, it is assumed that **Thomas B. Kinnan** was the owner of the album. However he was not found in the census and processors were not able to determine how he was related to the other Kinnans.

Henry Bristow: in 1870 he was 45 years old and was born in Indiana about 1825. He was married to Sarah Links Bristow. In 1870, they were living in Perry Township in Marion County, Indiana. Henry was listed in the census as a farmer.

Sarah Links Bristow: Sarah Links Bristow was born in Indiana about 1826 and was 44 years old in 1870. She was married to Henry Bristow. They had 7 children, David 17, Moah 16, Anthony 15, Sophina 13, Harriett 10, Frances 9, and Susan 5 years old. She was living in Perry Township, Marion County, Indiana and was listed in the census as a housekeeper.

Jarvis Calvert: According to the 1870 census, Jarvis P. Calvert was 27 years old. He was born in New York and married to Delia Calvert, they had a son, Archie B. Calvert, eleven months old. They were living in Mooresville, in Morgan County, Indiana. Jarvis was listed as a photographer.

Ed Dollarhide: Edmond Dollarhide appears in the 1860 Census living with his parent's Wastard and Sarah in Marion, Indiana. The Dollarhide siblings, Harriet (13), Noah (9), Edmond (7), and Orffer (5 months) were all in the home. Edmond was not found in the 1870 Census.

Noah Dollarhide: In 1870 Noah Dollarhide was 20 years old. He was born in Indiana about 1850. He was living in Decatur Township in Marion County, Indiana in the home of his sister Harriett Kinnan. Noah was listed in the 1870 census as a farm laborer.

Harriet (Dollarhide) Kinnan: In 1870 she was 22 years old and was born in Indiana. She married William Kinnan and they had two children, five year old Collins, and one year old Frances. They were living in Decatur Township in Marion County, Indiana in 1870.

Will Kinnan: He was born in Ohio about 1845. In 1870 he was married to Harriett (Dollarhide) Kinnan. They had two children, Collins, and Frances and were living in Decatur Township, Marion County, Indiana. Will was listed as a farmer.

Thomas B. Kinnan: was not found in the census for 1860 or 1870.

Frank Hiatt: There is a Frank Hiatt in the 1870 census, twenty four years old and he was born in Indiana in 1846. He was married to Frances Hiatt. The couple had a daughter

Elvina, two years old and they were living in Galesburg, Knox County, Illinois. Frank was also listed as an engineer in the 1870 census.

Franklin Kendall: in 1870 he was 41 years old. He was born in Pennsylvania and was married to Ara Kendall. They had one son Victor seven years old. They lived in Plainfield in Hendricks County, Indiana. He is listed as a merchant in the 1860 census.

Andrew Links: An Andrew Links was found in the 1860 Census. He was 22 years old and was born in Germany. At the time he was living in Ohio and working as a farm laborer. It could not be confirmed that this was the Andrew Links in the collection.

Henry Odell: He was born in Indiana about 1830 and was 40 years old in 1870. He was married to Anna Odell and they had five children, Margaret 17, Johny 14, Felty 11, Martha 5, and Mary, 3 years old. According to the 1870 census they were living in Fishing River, Ray County, Missouri and Henry was a farmer. According to the note in the album he was not related to anyone in the album.

Plainfield, Indiana: Located west of Indianapolis in Hendricks County, Plainfield is located along U.S. 40. Quakers from the Carolinas were the first settlers in the area in 1823. The post office opened in 1835 and the town was platted in 1839. Businesses in the town served travelers along the National Road.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The cartes de visite album came with 16 cartes de visite. These were removed from the album and maintained in their original order. The processor numbered the pages of the album and the corresponding images. Some of the images were identified with notes written on the album pages and some also had information written on small pieces of paper tucked in with the pictures.

The names and family information found in the album has been transcribed in the collection guide and is noted in quotation marks. The descriptive comments in square brackets are from the processors.

For preservation reasons the cartes de visite were removed from the album. The papers found in the album are stored with each corresponding image. Both the empty album and the cartes de visite are stored in one 4x5 flip-top box.
