HISTORICAL SKETCH

Monastery Immaculate Conception was founded in 1867 in Ferdinand, Indiana by Benedictine nuns from Kentucky. The nuns were sent to the area to teach German immigrant children. The nuns used German as their main language for speaking, teaching, and official transactions. In 2001, an Indiana Heritage Research Grant funded the translation and indexing of the monastery's German manuscripts into English. The manuscripts were translated by Dr. Eberhard Reichmann and Dr. Ruth Reichmann.
