BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Henry Schnull (1833–1905) was born in the province of Westphalia, Germany. In 1851, at the age of sixteen, he immigrated to the United States, to join his older brother, August Schnull. The two brothers arrived in Indianapolis, Indiana in 1852. Through much hard work, Henry Schnull eventually became a prominent wholesale grocer in Indianapolis.

Henry Schnull married Matilda Schramm (1836–1902) of Hancock County, Indiana, in 1856. Matilda Schramm was the daughter of German immigrants Jakob and Julia Schramm. Henry and Matilda Schnull had four children: Emma, Nannie, Gustav Adolf, and Julia Wilhemine. Emma and Nannie married into the Vonnegut family.

Julia Wilhemine Schnull (1864–1926) married John George Mueller (1860–1932) in 1888. J. George Mueller was secretary and treasurer of the Mooney-Mueller Drug Company of Indianapolis. They had two children, Clemens Otto Mueller and Norma Jean Mueller (1892–1977).

Clemens Otto Mueller (b. 8 Sept.1889-d. 20 Aug. 1963) married Zuleme Kinney (1890–1976) on 24 October 1914. Clemens and Zuleme had two children: Marjorie Jean Mueller and Horace George Mueller (1892–1977).

Marjorie Jean Mueller was born in Indianapolis on 5 June 1918. She died on 9 May 2007.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The collection contains one folder of genealogical materials relating to the Mueller family (and its extended relations to the Vonnegut, Schnull, and Schramm families) and four photograph albums.

The first photograph album is of unidentified people, presumably relatives of the Mueller family. The remaining three photograph albums pertain directly to the Mueller family. One photograph album features photographs of Clemens Otto Mueller and his immediate and extended family members from 1907–1910, and two photograph albums feature photographs of Clemens' daughter, Marjorie Jean Mueller: one album of her early childhood from 1918–1921 and the other album from 1935–1944. The later album of Marjorie Jean Mueller's life contains many photographs of her time at DePauw University and John Herron School of Arts. The photographs in albums directly pertaining to the Mueller family are generally well-labeled, which would allow identification of many family members via reference materials in the genealogical folder.

The collection originally included a book, *History of Lake Maxinkuckee*, by Daniel McDonald. The book has been transferred to the print collection. Many of the photographs in the photograph albums were taken at Lake Maxinkuckee, which is located near Culver, Marshall County, Indiana.
