BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Nathaniel Stifler (or Stiffler) was born about 1842 presumably in Kosciusko County, Indiana. In September, 1864 he was mustered in to Company I of the 35th Indiana Regiment (1st Irish). He was mustered out in June, 1865.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Stifler writes from a camp near Bulls Gap, Tennessee, to his brother, Samuel B. Stiffler with Co. B of the 13th Indiana Regiment in Wilmington, North Carolina, 13 April 1865. Nathaniel spells his last name with one "f" while Samuel uses two "fs". Nathaniel replies to a letter he had received from Samuel writes that he has received a letter from their mother and other general personal information. He also writes that he believes the war will soon be over and that General Forrest has surrendered to General Wilson.
