HISTORICAL SKETCH

Robert D. Coleman served as president of the Indianapolis Literary Club from 1966 to 1967. Around 1980 he wrote a paper titled "Now they call it Golden Manor." The paper discusses the Rooker vs. Fidelity Trust Company case, which began in 1912. The case involved a property and contract dispute. It went to the state supreme court six times, the appellate court once, and the U.S. Supreme Court twice before it ended in 1938.
