BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Isaac Newton Warren (b. 1869), the son of John Wesley (b. 1834) and Rhoda (Coen) Warren, was born in Jasper County, Indiana. He was one of six children. Warren attended public schools and graduated from Rensselaer High School in 1891. He taught school for one term before entering the State University at Bloomington, Indiana (present-day Indiana University). After graduating in 1897, Warren served as a principal in public schools throughout Indiana and in Iowa. He returned to Rensselaer in 1905 to fill the position of Superintendent of Schools in that city. He became the proprietor of the Rensselaer Clay Tile Works after he retired from school administration.

Warren married Alice Irwin in 1896. They had five children: Russell (b. 1897), Stuart, Carroll, Howard and Mary Alice. He was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church and the Independent Order of Odd Fellows. He also served as secretary/treasurer for the Co-operative Meat Market in Rensselaer.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This collection consists of a World War I ledger, ca. 1918-1919, which contains an alphabetical listing and brief biographical information about Indiana men who served during the war. The majority of those listed are from Rensselaer or surrounding areas. The ledger was probably kept by Isaac Newton Warren of Rensselaer.

Laid in items include two pages of Rensselaer Clay Tile Works stationary, which contain additional biographical notes for ledger entries, and two pages of Co-operative Meat Market stationary. Both stationary examples contain Warren's name. The stationary has been transferred to a folder (SC 2628) due to conservation concerns.
