

## Distributers Terminal Corporation

Founded: ca. 1868

Location: 102-104 Main St (now Wabash Ave.); Fort Harrison Industrial Park, Terre Haute

Distributers Terminal Corporation (DTC) has been providing logistics warehousing services to companies across the Midwest for more than 100 years. Established in 1868, the C.W.

Bauermeister Company (as DTC was originally known) dealt in grain and cured meats. In 1905, the owner, C.W. Bauermeister, a native of Prussia, established a wholesale grocery, the Chas. W.

Bauermeister Company. In 1923, the company later became known as Bauermeister Terminal and specialized in warehousing and carrying goods, wares and merchandise. The company name changed in 1935 to its current name, Distributers Terminal Corporation.

The company signed their first contract with its employees on March 12, 1913. That contract stipulated drivers would work 10-hour days. One-horse drivers were paid \$12.00 per week, and two-horse drivers were to receive \$13.50. The drivers were to clean and water their horses on Sundays and on four paid holidays throughout the year.

DTC operates multiple warehouse facilities, and has a fleet of trucks and state-of-the-art technology to assist with supply chain solutions for their clients.
