First Federal Savings Bank was established in Washington, Indiana in 1895. The Bank's first organizational meeting was held on January 31, 1895. First Federal's original Loogootee office began operations back on November 16, 1934 when W.J. Reynolds, Will Mosier, O.D. Calvin, J.J. Hoffman, John T. Prather, Joseph P. Smith and J.L. McGovern organized the Loogootee Federal Savings and Loan Association of Loogootee, Indiana. In early 2004, First Federal's board of directors began working on a strategic plan to expand the Bank's facilities to accommodate the substantial growth it had experienced over the years. Groundbreaking ceremonies for the Bank building were conducted on June 30, 2005, and the new facility was completed in May 2006.
