

**Fayette County, Longwood General Store Account Book,
April 1837 to July 1840**

On April 28, 1837, Ross Smiley opened a new account book and wrote “Longwood” at the top of the first page in a clear script. That day he lent John Conkling a bottle and charged the value to his account. Over the ensuing years in the account book, which runs until July 1840, Smiley listed the many goods he sold at his general store. His records reveal interesting details about life in pioneer Indiana. Local farmers and tradesmen bought yarn, calico, white shirting, buttons, combs, palm hats, shoes, tobacco, coffee, whiskey, butter plates, silverware, scythes, nails, tar, paper, eclectic readers, and more.¹

The location of Smiley’s store was originally unknown. Searching for customer names in census records led to results from Fayette County, Indiana, and a history of Fayette County then revealed more answers. In 1837 Longwood was little more than its post office and store. At the time of this ledger, Longwood was either in Harrison Township, according to census records, or Connersville Township, based on a history of Fayette County. Today, Longwood would be located in Fairview Township, which was formed in 1851. In the 1830s, a small town about one mile east of Longwood began to grow along William’s Creek. This town, known as Redville for its red houses, was originally settled by the Philpott family. It was here in 1832 that William Philpott became the first postmaster of the post office called Philpott’s Mills. However, in 1837 the post office moved to the small hamlet of Longwood and was renamed.²

Smiley became the new postmaster at Longwood, appointed April 24, 1837.³ It is unclear whether the general store had existed prior to this, but the store and post office were most likely in the same building. Born in Pennsylvania, Smiley moved in 1830 to what is today Fairview Township.⁴ Although his name never appears in the general store ledger, it is almost certain that this was his account book. In 1840 and 1850, he was engaged in commerce as a merchant, and in 1858 he ran a general store in Longwood.⁵ The absence of his name as a customer is another

clue. Occasional mention of postage is made in the account book, and the Longwood post office records held at the Indiana State Library for the same time period also have the same handwriting as the account book.⁶

The Longwood account book held in the collection of the Indiana Historical Society is a daybook, meaning that it recorded all transactions of the store. Daybooks usually had a corresponding ledger that would keep track of each individual account; however, the location of the Longwood ledger is unknown.⁷ The daybook of the Longwood store is organized and legible. Smiley begins his entries with the date, below which is the name of the customer and whether the entry is debit or credit. All customers appear to have held accounts with the store. Smiley marked all charges made to the account (debit) with “Dr” and all credits to the account with “Cr.” If someone else came on behalf of the customer, that person is also listed after an abbreviation that appears to be “pr,” which could mean “per” or “by.”⁸ For example, wives usually charged to their husbands’ accounts, and children in the family would often stop by. However, the account book also shows close connections between friends and neighbors, who picked up orders for one another. Unfortunately, the direct connection—whether familial or friend—is often unclear because only a first name is listed. Below the name, Smiley listed the objects purchased or credited and the price. Although some customers paid cash to balance their accounts, it was also acceptable to trade goods or labor, such as eggs or “8 days work at getting out wheat.”

The list below presents names that appear from representative selections of the account book. The left-hand column is the page on which the transaction was recorded, followed by the name of the account holder, and whether a different person had charged to their account (“pr”). The final column lists the transaction if another customer’s name was mentioned, or if the transaction provided information about the person. Listings beginning with “to” indicate debits; “by” refers to credits. Most of the customers were regulars, and their names appear often on the list. However, some irregular customers fall outside of the transcribed selections. The account book covers dates from April 28, 1837, to July 23, 1840, over 296 pages. The transcriptions below are from three different years: May to September 1837 (pages 1–45); October to December 1838 (pages 166–184); and January to April 1840 (pages 230–257).
