Ensuring your historical organization has adequate financial resources to educate, preserve collections, create exhibits, keep your doors open and respond to your community is one of the primary responsibilities of leading a museum, historical society or preservation group. Yet few of us serve local history organizations as board or staff members because we love to raise money. When you leave the workshop, you'll know the basic components of a development (fundraising) plan:

- Membership
- Foundation grants
- Annual fund
- Corporate support
- Major gifts

You'll also know what you need to do to create a development plan that works for your organization, including recruiting board members and other fundraising volunteers and budgeting for fundraising activities.

**Who should attend?** Board presidents, fundraising committee chairs, and paid or unpaid directors.
