HISTORICAL SKETCH

Terry and Mary Beth Ingram (b. ca 1940) live in Indianapolis and run a business called Phone Pro. During the "Desert

Storm" campaign in Kuwait and Iraq in 1990-1991, the Ingrams took on the project of writing "Pen Pal" letters to men serving in the campaign. Most of the letters were written by Mrs. Ingram. This was a major project (25 letters every ten days), made easier by use of a computer.

SCOPE AND CONTENT

This collection, filling nine folders, contains correspondence dated 1990-1991. It is arranged by correspondent. Single exchanges of letters are in one folder at the end. The correspondence tells a good deal about both the Ingrams and the men at the front.
